  With the expansion of the day's topics, relevance to many positions throughout the library profession, and continual updates to themes regarding current needs, this conference is now intended to meet the needs of multiple levels of staff throughout various library types.
- Annual Membership Meeting This annual event allows members from around the region to network and learn together while also incorporating the official annual updates and board voting needs for the meeting's aspect of the day.

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## **EXPLORATION OF NEW SERVICES**

In focus groups and online surveys, TBLC members requested several new services for TBLC to consider in the coming years. Those which will be explored by TBLC staff include:

- Creating a preferred vendor list which would include a list of potential speakers, lists of people available for interim or temporary staffing assignments, lists of local authors available for library programs, and resources for book disposal.
- Exploring the possibility of conducting geographically convenient retreats for Friends of the Libraries for best practices and resource sharing.
- Providing assistance to libraries in the creation of a "Library of Things."
- Providing grant writing assistance through referrals to existing resources.

TBLC will continue to meet member needs through the hard work and dedication of its staff, as well as through the work of its standing committees. Current committees include:


